# Our ambitious and inspiring curriculum for all

The KS3 curriculum begins with students exploring classic literary heritage texts, then evolving to see themselves in contemporary works. They practise various writing styles, including narrative and persuasive texts, whilst honing rhetoric and expression, fostering confident, reflective writers and critical thinkers.

The KS4 English Language and Literature curriculum offers a robust programme, featuring *Macbeth*, *Blood Brothers*, *A Christmas Carol*, and poetry on themes of power and conflict. Students explore ambition, class, and morality while practicing analytical, creative, and persuasive writing. This curriculum develops critical thinking and communication skills for academic success and real-world challenges.

#### Our curriculum intent

Our goal at ASA is to have students leave who are functionally literate and able to decode the world around them. We hope to foster their skills of comprehension, critical thinking and reasoning through our curriculum.

## Marking and feedback

Students receive regular teacher feedback on work in lesson and formal marking of assessment work occurs once per half term.

### **Quality assurance**

Lessons are centrally planned and undergo robust QA through the department leaders. Each unit is reflected upon, evaluated and revisited every year.

#### **Curriculum enrichment**

The department regularly host enrichment opportunities ranging from writing clubs on a lunchtime to running competitions with national publications. We are hosting 4 theatre company visits for KS4.

#### Intervention

Intervention for KS4 happens every morning with specialist English tutors working to address misconceptions and capitalise on marginal gains.

We also offer L6 revision for Y11 every Wednesday.
