PSHE

In PSHE lessons this half term:

Year 7 will be focusing on relationship safety: the law, dangers and consequences of sending nude images and upskirting, and introducing consent and how to stay safe in any relationship.

Year 8 will also be learning about relationship safety, consent and an introduction to contraception.


Year 9 focuses on how to stay true to yourself and your values in any relationship, the capacity to give consent, contraception and the risks of STIs.



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Year 10 will learn how to manage breakups safely, the risks of unprotected sex and how to stay safe as well as what options are open to you in the event of an unplanned pregnancy and what constitutes a forced marriage and what is an arranged marriage.

Year 11 lessons will be on how to spot and protect yourself from relationship abuse and coercive control, sexual health, the role of intimacy in a relationship, how pornography can impact relationships and individuals and what safe sex is.



Parents and carers please also note that students can access free sanitary products whilst at the academy and can also ask to take products home over the holidays to save costs.

Careers

Year 10 Work Experience Reminder:

All Y10 students will complete 1 week of a work experience placement during Monday 23rd March - Friday 27th March. If students have not handed in their consent form you must do so.

Placements must be found by Friday 30th January in order to get risk assessments completed.

HETA Assembly & Workshop:

Last half-term HETA delivered an assembly to Year 11 students about apprenticeships. A follow-up workshop was delivered to a group of interested Year 11 students. The workshop focused on applying to HETA. Students showed high levels of engagement and participation throughout the sessions.

Young Enterprise:

The first meeting of students involved in Young Enterprise took place before Christmas. Students shared ideas and collaboratively selected a product to design and sell. Strong teamwork was demonstrated throughout the session. Students showcased effective problem-solving skills and leadership skills were evident as students worked together and allocated roles. We can't wait to see their business idea blossom.

IntoUniversity:

IntoUniversity hosted a workshop for our Year 8 students, focusing on strategies to enhance memory. The students were fantastic and can now count to 10 in Japanese, thanks to a clever little story!

Quality of Education

KS3 Assessments:

The KS3 Assessments will take place in January for most subjects across the academy. The students will be expected to revise for these at home using the range of revision strategies they

have been taught and the links provided on the school website. Students can sign into their school accounts from the website links, these will take you to the revision pages for each subject area.

The 3 revision strategies we have focused on as an academy are:

- Revision clocks
- Flash cards
- Quizzing

Finally, a reminder that all Maths and Science SPARX homework is due every Wednesday at 8am. Data shows that students who have 100% completion rates every week have improved by as many as 7 grades!
