Our ambitious and inspiring curriculum for all

The curriculum has been designed as a 5 year programme that is cyclical and returns to consolidate and develop on topics each year.

It is intended that AO1, AO2 and AO3 is embedded within all year groups with an emphasis on mastering previous knowledge, skills and understanding and developing these into new avenues within the same topic areas each year. The cycle of learning each year in mathematics includes ten overarching topic areas: Geometry, Algebra, Fractions Decimals & Percentages, Sequences, Number, Statistics, Ratio, Measures, Graphs and Transformations.

Our curriculum intent

Marking and feedback

Regular use of mini whiteboards allows for speedy assessment, support and intervention where necessary.

Teachers regularly circulate and spend time assessing the You Do and ILZ tasks in lesson.

There are 10 unit assessments across the course of the year.

In addition there are 2 key assessment points in each year group from Y7-10.

Intervention

Y11 students access intervention support during morning tutor time and Period 6 sessions.

Quality assurance

Regular learning walks and book looks take place weekly. Student voice is undertaken regularly as well.

Staff review and reflect on each unit studied which then leads to any necessary adaptations and amendments.
