Dear Parent or Carer,

As our year 10 students have now officially graduated into year 11, I will be writing to you weekly in order to keep you informed of key quality of education actions we are taking to support your child.

Over the last few weeks, we have consistently emphasised the importance of students engaging with activities additional to their lessons so that they can approach their GCSE exams with confidence for success. Here is a brief outline of what we expect students to be doing:

- maintaining a high attendance to school
- engaging with their in school/after school intervention (**those who are identified as needing it will receive weekly invitations by Mrs Lowe**)
- attending lesson 6 which is open to all students (**the rotation has been shared with parents and individual invitations are going out weekly by Mrs Lowe**)
- revising via SPARX for Maths and Science and completing their weekly assignment, **due in at 8am every Wednesday**
- revising at home, using the recommended subject rotation and materials, available on our Liberty Academy website, under Curriculum, Supporting Learning at Home, Year 11 Home/Tutor Revision Resources.

We have completed our formal mock window and as a result of exceptional behaviour and engagement, our year 10 students enjoyed a well-earned ice cream provided by the school on Friday 26/6.

Now that we have completed the planned mock window, we will be mopping up Maths and English missed mocks on Monday 29/6 and Tuesday 30/6.

Information about mock results will follow in due course.

In other news, this week, we have some key events coming up for our year 10 students:

- **SPARX Maths and Science re-launch:** our data shows quite poor engagement at the moment. We will be conducting a re-launch via the House Collective Worship sessions this week. Please support the school in reminding your child to meet the weekly deadline outlined above.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all your support so far this year. I will be writing to you weekly to flag up some key events or priorities which pertain to our year 10 students. In the meantime, please continue to support your child by ensuring regular revision and attendance to school. National exam performance data reflects the importance of attendance and revision which are key drivers to successful exam performance.
